

Southport Festival



Yesterday we went to the Southport Festival. The forecast was not encouraging but having practised the dances we decided to go. This year we were travelling in cars as we only had eight dancers going. The journey over was uneventful until we were almost in sight of Southport when two lots of road-works added twenty minutes to our journey. It was raining and windy when we arrived and the ground proved to be a skating rink but we made it into the Convention Centre (the old Floral Hall) and had a good afternoon's dancing as the rain continued to pour.

The children danced well and their new made up solo dance was very well done and deserved the applause that followed it. There was slight hiccup after the Dashing White Sergeant when the balloons failed to escape their net nest but eventually they came down on to a crowd of expectant dancers. Then it was all over for another year.

We left Southport in the pouring rain and negotiated the road-works with only one wait for the lights to change and regained the motorways easily but then! The traffic built up, sleety rain was replacing the pure rain

and the pace of travel dropped dramatically. The rain, snow and sleet continued as the traffic got more intense and we suffered two major hold-ups of 30 and 45 minutes as we climbed slowly to the top of the Pennines. We felt great sympathy for all the drivers and passengers in that line of traffic because their wait would be far greater than ours had been.

Branch Shop Whats new Books & Cds

Auld Friends Meet - The Collected Leaflets of Roy Goldring includes 49 dances.

Dancing On Air - 12 new dances devised by Bill Zobel & Muriel Johnstone with music composed by Muriel Johnstone and played by her on the accompanying CD

Berkhamsted Diamond collection contains 17 dances with the CD by Sandy Nixon and his Scottish Dance Band.

The Geordie Diamond is not a new book but Robert Whitehead and the Danelaw Band have now produced the CD to accompany it.

6 x Through the Dance by Muriel Johnstone is a compilation of tracks with "6x32" in Jig, Reel and S/S time. It is intended for smaller class sizes where you have only 3 cpl sets. Some tracks are "3x32": once through, a pause to allow that couple to step to the foot of the set, then a 4-bar intro and another 32 bars, as well as some "6x40" tracks in Jig and Reel rhythms.

The Scotia Suite by Roy Goldring and the Dookie Bookie, published by the 30th Australian Winter School, Melbourne & District Branch are back in print after being out of print for a couple of years. If you missed them first time round, now's your chance.

A Dancing Tour, with 10 dances devised by Jim Rae was published in 1999. We have not stocked this before but the dances came recommended.
