The programme consisted of general round the room dances for everyone, interspersed by individual dances for three different ability levels, the advanced teams doing both a strathspey and reel or jig. Both halves of the programme were enriched by demonstrations of other forms of dancing, including Ball room and Jazz to the James Bond Theme. The afternoon was rounded off with the presentation of certificates of attendance and participation in the demonstration.

# WEST PARK DEMOLITION THREATENED!

Unbelievable, but true! Apparently a local entrepreneur has submitted a planning application to Leeds City Council for the erection of a Rugby Academy on the West Park site. The original application proposed the demolition of all the existing buildings! A revised application is now to be made, but no- one knows what is in it!

This person does not even own the site, but that is no barrier to gaining planning permission, apparently. Local residents are gathering support to oppose the plans, as are users of the Centre. These include the Northern Theatre Ballet who use the gyms as rehearsal space, Leeds schools which use the playing fields and the Friends of the Youth Orchestra who also rehearse there.

The situation at the moment is that the local councillor, Judith Blake, is having a series of consultation meetings with interested parties. We have been invited along to put our case and will be doing so most forcefully.

The branch committee will be sending representatives to a meeting on 12th March 98 at 4pm. If you have any thoughts then speak to someone at the dance on Sat 21st February 98.

On the 14th February the branch entered a ladies team and junior team at the Newcastle Festival held in the University Ballroom.


