Musician's Workshop

Last year the focus was on the violin and next year the concentration will be on playing for dancing and the course will be led by a pianist.

Another successful course this year earns thanks to all the day school team who worked on this, particularly Heather Foote, who leads the team for the musicians day.

Winter School 2017

Having set off for Pitlochry this February, we wondered if we would get there as the forecast was so poor. However after negotiating snowy central Scotland, we reached our destination to find it green and springlike. Some of those travelling by train weren't as lucky though, and experienced severe delays. We soon settled into our room at the Atholl Palace, which has very comfortable accommodation and does an excellent breakfast!

The week consisted of classes on four mornings, with a different teacher and musician each day. There was social dancing in the hotel on three evenings and a ceilidh on the fourth. The week culminates in a Ball in Blair Castle.

The teacher that stood out for us was Johan Maclean, whom we had not come across before. We liked her style of teaching, and her unique approach to dancing. Also new to us was Raphaelle Orgeret from Lyon, who warmed us up (with variable success) with steps from the

Charleston. We enjoyed all the classes though. What was a revelation was how much we enjoyed the keyboard music for the classes, having rather thought it inferior to the accordion. Peter Shand was excellent on a real piano, and Luke Brady proved his musical knowledge on the keyboard.

The dances at the evening socials were mostly well known ones. Again there were different musicians each night, though for the dances we did prefer the music of the accordion. The programmes were all chosen by the musicians, and the MCs were different staff members.

Pitlochry is a pleasant town on the River Tummel, and not too busy in February. It is famous for its thriving theatre, and also for its salmon ladder. We enjoyed the walk down to the town for classes each morning, and there were several good sandwich shops where we bought lunch. The afternoons were free, or there were organised trips, quizzes, and walk throughs for the evening if required.

The ceilidh was compered by the inimitable William Williamson, and consisted of various 'turns', and easy dances. The highlight of the week though was the ball, in the wonderful ballroom at Blair Castle, to the music of Jim Lindsay and his band. The programme was devised by Adam Brady, who did an excellent job - not for nothing is he a dancer as well as a musician.

All in all, this was a most enjoyable week, friendly and sociable. It was well organised and presented by Luke Brady. Anyone who fancies trying it next year should contact Moira Thomson at HQ and ask to be put on the advance list, as the event always sells out quickly.
