Alec Green, 1930-2015

The following atricles are reprinted with permission from the Leeds Scottish Country Dance Club Newsletter.

Many of you will remember Alec, as he has been an enthusiastic member of our club since its foundation in the 50s. He worked very hard on committee as president and secretary on our behalf. He was intelligent and very athletic, with a wide range of interests.

He trained to be a teacher at James Graham College in Leeds. He did his National Service in the RAF and apart from his Scottish Country Dancing he helped to teach an International dance class. He was a member of two walking clubs and Leeds Athletic Club.

When my family and I came back to Leeds in the 1970s Alec was a very prominent person in the Leeds dancing scene. He was a member of The Glenlee Dancers, and was chosen to represent the City of Leeds on three cultural trips to Germany, Holland and France.

In more recent years, when he was spending a lot of time with Trish, I got to know him more as we went camping, walking and he joined us in family festivities. He particularly appreciated good home cooking!!!!!!

In 2006 his health suddenly deteriorated and he could not live alone. His brother Mick and sister-in-law Jenny took him to live with them in Whitby. He steadily worsened and eventually went into Nursing Home Care in Saltburn. He remained there until he died.

I recently acquired a wonderful photograph of Alec dancing with Avis in his CHRISTMAS trademark red shirt. This is how I am choosing to remember him. *Sheila Toft*

I worked with Alec on both Club and Festival committees, he was always thorough in everything he did, and his last official position was President, 1996-2000. However he continued to write our newsletters until 2004 - they were always very interesting. He was always a popular MC. Roy Goldring devised 'The Scribe' for Alec for all his hard work with the newsletters. I found this quote in one of Alec's newsletters from 2003: "Still, we do have five more dances before the close of the year when there will be a time for the red shirts to appear accompanied by mince pies which all help to put a punch into the festive season". I am certain that Alec in his red shirt at the Christmas dances will bring back memories to those who knew him. A memory I have of Alec is one Christmas, eight club members decided to do some Medieval Dancing as entertainment at the interval and Alec danced and taught us, we hired costumes from Homburgs in Call Lane, and we really felt like courtiers. Patricia and Alice remember this occasion as they were two of the dancers. It's strange that of the 8 dancers, 5 have been President of the Club over its history and one a Vice President. Happy memories.

Musicians' Day School

The Musicians' Day School took place in February this year after missing a year from the previously annual event. 38 musicians came, mostly from Yorkshire and Lancashire, though some from further afield. I had expected around 15 to 20 to attend, so was excited and daunted in proportion as the application forms continued to arrive! The final total was 37.



The day was led by lan Muir from Prestwick who organised this diverse group into a cohesive unit for the evening dance, with about 20 staying on to join him to play for the dancing. There was a mix of regular attendees and new faces, and lan encouraged,guided and gently instructed the group. It was an intensive, fast paced and exhausting day, playing through 18 sets of music incorporating often 4 tunes apiece (8 in The Deil amang the Tailors!), repeating and shaping some of them further under lan's tuition. Ian praised the quality of the musicianship; I hope those dancing shared his view?

The size, acoustics and variable heating around the room caused some difficulties, but the overriding comments were very appreciative, with requests to return to the annual pattern.

Providing a hot lunch for the group was my biggest concern, and I wish to express a huge thank you those who assisted with making and serving this! It was very much appreciated by the group.

I am grateful for the expert guidance, gentle prompting, practical assistance and encouragement given by many individuals in making the day such a success.

A regular Leeds Scottish Music Night has developed from this Musicians' Day, and there may be further opportunities for musicians to improve their skills for playing for dancing in the Leeds area. Please ask if you would like to know more.
