Good news of Ivy Lawson



Many of you will remember the indomitable lvy Lawson, our veteran dancer who finally hung up her shoes at the age of 90 years. Well, she is still indomitable. The following words are from a letter sent to me by her niece Diane.

After suffering a severe illness last February, Ivy has been recuperating in a care home near her family in Thornton Cleveleys, on the Fylde Coast. She has made a good recovery and is enjoying full time care and this is now going to be her permanent home.

As you may know, Ivy was diagnosed with Alzheimer's about 5 years ago and has been looked been looked after by the Bramley Memory Services and carers for some time now. With the great support of friends and neighbours, she has been able to stay in her own home and, soon to celebrate her 95th birthday, has decided that the time is right to move nearer to her family.

All of her family live quite close; nephew Keith and Dorothy are in the process of buying a house nearby and niece Diane, her husband Bill, their daughters and grandchildren live just a few minutes away, so lvy has lots of visitors.

She is making the most of all the activities available in the home, especially the day trips, a walk on the Cleveleys promenade and an ice cream is favourite! She is even teaching some of the carers how to dance!! She loves to play board games and is very competitive so that she is now undisputed queen of the cards and dominoes club.

Ivy sends her best wishes and would love to hear from you. Although she has no short term memory, she has fond recollections of her times with the Scottish Dancing team, Gerry Thrushel's birdwatching group, the Mother's Union and St. Peters Church at Bramley, The Bramley History Society (of which she was a founder member) and also her happy days out with Bramley Elderly Action.

Ivy was my neighbour for 44 years. I have been privileged to know her and witness her zest for life and people. A very sociable lady, with friends who were all over the world, she was undaunted by what life threw at her. She was, and is, a great example of making the most of what she had and getting the best out of it. The three dances devised for her by Brenda really reflected the measure of "our Ivy". Although Ivy left it a bit late to start Scottish Country dancing (75 years of age) she didn't do half bad.

She had an inbuilt feeling for the music (which she truly loved) and had had a lot of experience of ceilidh dancing from her many visits to Scotland. She always got to the right place at the right time, even if sometimes she needed a teeny bit of steering in the latter part of her career. Her ability of ballroom dancing was quite unique for one of her age and certainly she amazed the congregation during a social evening in The Tarbet Hotel when on holiday in Scotland during her 90th year. In fact that evening, by example, she rekindled the love and ability to dance in someone who had been a prolific dancer, who had been struck with cancer - and beaten it, but had lost her confidence to dance. Ivy's presence encouraged this lady to take up the threads again. So when you dance the three cracking dances that Brenda devised - "A Dance for Ivy" (79th birthday), "All the Eights" (88th birthday) and the exhilarating "Nifty Ninety" (90th birthday), be sure that the spirit of Ivy will be dancing them with you.
